## **Brush Pickup**

BRUSH will be picked up weekly by Superior Waste Removal, under contract with the Town of Clay. Brush collection is Tuesday 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Following is a list of guidelines that you must adhere to for brush to be collected:



- Limbs will be collected provided they are bundled and tied together (twine or rope ONLY), less than 5' long and less than 50 pounds in weight.
- Limbs shall have a diameter no greater than 6". Brush must be in rigid plastic or metal containers or biodegradable lawn and leaf bags. Full containers shall not weigh more than 50 pounds.
- Torn, ripped or overweight bags will not be collected.
- Plastic bags may not be used either inside or outside of the rigid containers.
- Items should not be placed in any manner that obstructs traffic, pedestrians, or drainage.
- Items must be placed in a manner easily visible and accessible.
- All potted plants shall be removed from their container (pot). The container will not be collected as part of this service. Dirt/ Sod must be removed from plant roots.
- Removal and disposal of trees are the sole responsibility of the property owner and are not under the brush contract.

The Town of Clay Board meetings have deliberated on several propositions. Some that may be of interest to our community are:

- Resolution authorizing the Town Supervisor to enter into an agreement with National Grid for the conversion of 2,216 (street) lights to LED at a cost of \$568,505.02.
- The adoption of a resolution authorizing the installation of one (1) 96w LED fixture to be installed on POLE 105 to help illuminate the entrance to Moyers Corners Fire Department
- Ongoing discussion and resident inquiries regarding the Waterhouse Road Project plans to install a solar array on properties along Waterhouse Road in Clay/Liverpool.

## **Home Sale Trends in Irongate**

Many homeowners are watching the current Real Estate Market with great interest. Bottom line: It is a great time to sell! Why? Well, there are several factors at play, but experts agree that a historically low inventory of available homes, combined with low interest rates has created a high demand for homes and affordable mortgages.

For example: A \$10,0000 difference in purchase price, only impacts the buyer by approximately \$42.20 per month (based on current market rates). This has little impact on the buyer, but puts more money in the pockets of sellers. With so few homes available on the market, we are also seeing terms that are very favorable to the seller, as buyers do all that they can to compete in multiple offer scenarios.

As of 5/1, the average list price of homes sold (but not yet closed) in our community: \$241,600 This demonstrates a marked increase from the previous year's list average of \$188,000. So what's the catch? Well, there is still a shortage of available homes, so sellers who need a place to go will need to have a plan. There are many options however, including making your home sale contingent on "Seller finding suitable housing", lease-back options and more.

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
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
