Spring is here! Check Your Sump Pump! by Donna Jordan

You know the saying: An Ounce of Prevention is Worth a Pound of Cure. It's true! Three quick things that you can do to avoid the expense, heartache and frustration of a flooded basement:

- 1. Check your sump pump! You can manually lift the float arm or add water to the crock to make sure that your sump pump is operating properly.
- 2. Check your insurance! Sump pump failure is an additional coverage under almost all homeowner's insurance. Call your insurance company and ask if you have coverage for damage from a failed sump pump. Typically, this coverage costs as little as \$40 a year.
- 3. Purchase a water alarm! This is a small, inexpensive device that you place on the floor next to the sump pump crock. It has a moisture sensor and will release a piercing alarm if it comes into contact with water.

You may also want to look into a backup system. Battery powered backups will keep your sump pump running for a few hours in the event of a power failure. Water powered backups will keep your sump pump running indefinitely and also provide a backup pump.

Is Aluminum Wiring a Concern?

I have sold several homes in our neighborhood and all of them have had all important to know what this means to you as a home owner and a possible seller.

- Aluminum wiring is NOT a defect. This is how homes were built for a period from 1960 to the mid 70's.
- Aluminum and copper do not mix well. Anytime that you add a new fixture, outlet or switch, you will be connecting aluminum to copper. This must be done in a way that will not pose a safety hazard. Aluminum wiring can be "pig tailed". There are a few different ways to address aluminum wiring, but the most common is to have all connections "pig tailed" with special connectors. An electrician can address these connections and you do not have to have your entire house rewired.

According to the Carson Dunlop School of Home Inspection: The electrical authority in Ontario, Canada says, "Aluminum wiring itself is safe and if proper connections and terminations are made without damaging the wire and using approved materials installed in accordance with the Ontario Electrical Safety Code and the manufacturer's instructions, there should be no problems with the aluminum wiring installation."

If you notice unusually warm switch or outlet covers, discolored or melted insulation or flickering lights, you should call a qualified electrician. The bottom line: When properly addressed and maintained, aluminum wiring is perfectly acceptable.

Brush Collection has Started

The Town of Clay Brush Collection begins on March 17 and continue every Tuesday until December 8. Brush includes leaves, grass clip-pings, shrub cuttings, small branch-es and twigs, and must be placed in rigid plastic or metal containers. Biodegradable lawn bags are acceptable, if kept dry and intact. Place all containers outside of road pavement and gutters so as not to obstruct traffic or block drainage. There is one item that has come up in the Town of Clay Board meetings that will be evident in our community. Verizon will be installing 5G Wireless Equipment on the utility poles in and around our community. These units are described as "about the size of a backpack" and will be installed by Verizon technicians. They do not pose any safety concerns and will serve to establish 5G connections throughout the Town of Clay. You are likely to see service vehicles during the installation of these units.

School Board Meetings: The district will adhere to the Governor's executive order to keep gatherings under 50 people. In addition, the public comment portion of the agenda has been removed. Community members wishing to provide their input and/or comments to the Board of Education may submit those questions or concerns through electronic means. Communication may be submitted directly to the Board President, Mr. Craig Dailey (<u>cdailey@liverpool.k12.ny.us</u>) or to the School Superintendent, Dr. Mark Potter (<u>mpotter@liverpool.k12.ny.us</u>). The Board of Education meeting originally scheduled for April 13, has been canceled.
