School News by Julie Matson

At the School Board meeting held via Zoom on Monday, May 18th, the following date-sensitive items were discussed (some of which are subject to change):

End of the School Year:



June 16 - Last day for students and staff June 12 - Last day for new instruction for students

June 15 & 16 - Students can turn in any outstanding work

June 17 - Grades due in SchoolTools for students in grades 7-12; Grades K-6 will receive no grades, comments only.

Return of District Property - There is no intent to collect Chromebooks except from graduating seniors. Proposed options for return of property (i.e. textbooks to be reassigned to different students in the Fall; items rented from the district such as instruments, calculators, etc.) are as follows. These are proposals and are currently still under review.

June 11 - Collection at bus stops

June 12, 15 & 16 - curbside drop off at schools (to coincide with the 16th being the last day to turn in outstanding work)

<u>Budget</u>

June 9 - Budget Vote (Mail in ballot only - no in person voting) - In a typical year, we have 1,200 to 1,500 who vote out of a possible 35,000 registered voters. Ballots will come with postage pre-paid so no need to affix postage when returning the ballot. Ballots may be returned anytime after they are received. All ballots must be <u>received</u>, not postmarked, by June 9, in the district office in order to be counted.

May 22 - postcards sent to all district residences

May 26 - Public Hearing (held via Zoom); Ballots arriving in mailboxes

May 29 - School Bell, with details on the budget

June 9 - Returned ballots assessed

June 10 - Counting of ballots begins - hand counted with secondary verification

June 12 - Process of ballot counting and results expected to be completed (depending on the volume of ballots received)

Residents will be asked to vote (yes or no) on the Budget, Transportation, and the budget for the Liverpool Public Library. Voting will also include voting for 3 open School Board seats (4 candidates) and 1 Library Trustee position.

Education 2020

June 8 - The Superintendent will make a final recommendation to the Board regarding the Education 2020 initiative. (School Board meeting via Zoom)

June 22 - The Board will vote on whether or not to approve. (School Board meeting via Zoom). School board meetings begin at 7 p.m. There is no public communication.
